Third Graders will explore the third grade curriculum through six International Baccalaureate themes, which make up our Program of Inquiry. Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Religion are woven throughout these units. Here are some of the highlights from Third Grade:

Third Grade Program of Inquiry:

Who We Are: Third Graders learn about change-makers and how we can use our talents to make a positive impact in the world. Our annual third grade Wax Museum allows students to research and portray an inspiring historical figure.

Where We Are: Our class discovers how geography affects the way we live and studies how indigenous groups use natural resources. Students will live a day in the life of the Maidu tribe by incorporating what we have learned in the classroom.

How the World Works: Third Graders take action by creating an invention to solve a problem! Through this unit of inquiry, students gain knowledge about the invention process and the impact inventions have on the world.

How We Organize Ourselves: This unit is an inquiry into the significant role that jobs play in the advancement of a community. Students learn about different careers by interviewing others, researching careers, and listening to guest speakers.

How We Express Ourselves: Through literature and storytelling, students develop an appreciation for creativity in writing. Students grow in their ability to write and tell stories that express ideas and values.

Sharing the Planet: Students investigate how animals use adaptations to survive in their environment. During this unit, third graders have the opportunity to collect and identify aquatic invertebrates in our local American River Habitat!

Additionally, third grade students will have the opportunity to be creative through various art projects, songs, plays, and learning cursive! Third grade is a year full of exploration and growth!
