



## **Kindergarten Program of Inquiry:**

Who We Are: Kindergarteners learn about community helpers and what it means to be a helper. We learn that everyone in a community can make an impact, no matter how old you are. At the end of the unit they brainstorm a problem they see in their school community and develop a solution to that problem.

Where We Are in Place and Time: This unit discusses the importance of maps and how we use them to explore our community and the communities around the world. We will end our discovery of maps by creating a map of a community we are a part of that includes the important features of that community.

**How We Express Ourselves:** Art is a driving force for self-expression. During this unit, people convey their uniqueness as individuals through the arts. We will learn how to use different art forms to share our talents with each other.

**Sharing the Planet:** Kindergarteners investigate the needs of plants and what they need in order to survive in their environment. Each student in Kindergarten plants their own seeds and cultivates them through each stage of life, all while observing and recording their observations in their plant journals.

Phonics, Math, Science, Social Studies, Religion, Technology, Spanish, and PE are woven throughout these units and drive our learning all year long.

In addition to the in depth units we explore, we also have a special relationship with our 8th grade students! Our Big Buddy and Little Buddy partnership with 8th graders allows both classes to grow as individuals. Kindergarteners create bonds with their Big Buddy that last for years. Kindergarten is an exciting year of exploration and growth!
