Second graders will explore the second grade curriculum through six International Baccalaureate themes, which make up our Program of Inquiry. Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Religion are woven throughout these units. Here are some of the highlights from Second Grade Grade:

Second Grade Program of Inquiry:

Who We Are: Second graders learn how beliefs and values are formed and nurtured. Through literature and personal experiences, students share how their values influence their actions.

Where We Are: Our class discovers how individual action can affect our civil rights. Students will explore the meaning of equality and how their actions can impact their community.

How the World Works: Second graders gain knowledge about natural cycles of the earth. By studying the impact of the four seasons, the moon phases, and the water cycle, students discover how these changes affect the world around us.

How We Organize Ourselves: Students learn about how the exchange of goods and services impact our community. Second graders participate in the annual Market Day.

How We Express Ourselves: Through nature walks and field trips, students find meaning by interacting with nature. Second graders share their appreciation for the natural world around them through various writing and art projects.

Sharing the Planet: Students investigate how animals change during their life cycle. By seeing the transition of a caterpillar to a butterfly and a larvae to a ladybug, second graders get a first hand experience at life cycles!
